

WMFA – Celebrating 25 Years!



The 2016/2017 season marks the West Michigan Flute Association's 25th year! With a mission to provide a showcase and forum for the flute, the organization actively seeks to provide a community for flutists with playing opportunities, recitals and workshops; it also seeks to add to flute choir repertoire with commissions for flute choir music. WMFA's primary focus is their performing groups: West Michigan Flute Orchestra and Great Lakes Flutes. WMFA has also sponsored youth flute groups over the years, primarily the WMFA High School Flute Ensemble, founded by Karen Betz-Griewahn and the WMFA Middle School Flute Choir, founded by Christy Kliewer.

In this 25th year, if members are asked what makes WMFA special to them, some might point to the social gatherings - like the lunches we have together after the first rehearsal of each season, or the ad hoc groups formed for special purposes like Christmas and local festivals. Others might point to highlights in their years of playing with the flute orchestra, such as playing at our beloved Darlene Dugan's first spring concert with 18 of her students at Calvin College in 1991, or at her final concert in 2012 with 60 flutists, many of whom had come out specifically to play under Darlene one more time before her retirement. Some remember playing with the Alpenhorns at the Tulip Time Festival in Holland and at the National Flute Association Convention in 2014, and others the magnificent experience of playing with the Holland Chorale and Ars Voce vocal groups from Michigan in 2015 in a first ever piece commissioned for flute orchestra and vocal choir by Jenni Brandon. WMFA has been a leader in the flute world for commissioning new music for flute orchestra. WMFA is widely respected as one of the premiere flute orchestras across the United States. WMFA has commissioned several works by our own GR's Dave Wells as other Michigan composers. We are proud of the heritage of commissioning that we have established in the flute world.

In addition to great memories, some are simply proud to be a part of an organization that promotes the flute in a non-competitive way. They are proud to have helped commission 16 new works for flute choir, to be a part of such a large flute community, and to have helped purchase 2 contra basses (affectionately named George and Gracie) and several other low instruments for the group to play. Playing flute in a community group helps people enjoy flute, whether it is a hobby, a serious passion or part of their job. Our members come from all walks of life- whether students, scientists, doctors, teachers, band directors, factory workers, school board members, stay at home moms, medical technicians, just to name a few. We meet together to form a common purpose- to promote the love we have of the flute and flute orchestra music. WMFA has sponsored many flute seminars, 2 flute festivals, many masterclasses, playing sessions and have been featured performers at several NFA conventions. We will once again be featured at the 2017 NFA convention in Minneapolis in August 2017, playing with the Madison Flute Choir and a local choir to perform the Jenni Brandon, "America Belongs To Us" work.

Our board has worked diligently over the past 25 years to provide innovative programming for the flute orchestra and other flute adventures we have had. Planning meetings always seem to center around food, whether at a local restaurant or potluck. There have been so many individuals that have helped out by being a board member and serving in ad hoc roles and worked so diligently for this organization.

Here's looking toward and forward to our next 25 years together making great music!
