WEST MICHIGAN FLUTE ORCHESTRA



The West Michigan Flute Orchestra is one of the largest continuously rehearsing flute orchestras in the country. Founded by Darlene Dugan 25 years ago, this organization has performed conventions of the National Flute Association in 1997, 2000, 2004, 2008 and 2011, 2014 and 2017. They played by invitation in the West Michigan Flute Day at West Michigan State University, the White Lake Chamber Music Festival and in the South East Michigan Flute Festival in 2012. Other performances have included a performance at Holland's Tulip Time, the Grand Rapids Festival of the Arts, Free at Three, and ARTPRIZE.

One of the primary goals of the West Michigan Flute Association is to support the flute community and current American Composers with annual commissions. WMFA has commissioned and premiered 16 original flute choir pieces by Catherine McMichael, Matt Doran, Darlene Dugan (2), Valerie Coleman, Ken Kreuzer, Richard Cerchia, David Wells (4), and Kelly Via (2), Kathleen Mayne, Jenni Brandon and Theo Ndawillie II.



JULIE SOOY has directed the West Michigan Flute Orchestra since 2012. She is in her 20th year of teaching various courses at Hope College including World Music, Aural Skills, First year Seminar and Flute Choir; she also does a great deal of advising to freshmen and sophomores. Julie also directs Great Lakes Flutes and Flutes Soli, is assistant principal flute with the Holland Symphony and also teaches flute privately in the Holland Area. She has spent time studying the Indonesian Gamelan music in Bali, Indonesia and received degrees in Music Performance, Music Theory and Music Education at Bowling State University in Ohio. Julie is devoted to enjoying music through the flute and helping others to do so as well. She loves working with flutists who are passionate about making music and thrives on helping them to do it well.
